For more than half a century, efforts to foment and exaggerate legitimate scientific doubts have been key to perpetuating confusion about environmental health hazards, ranging from asbestos to tobacco. Cell phone science has evolved in a highly charged environment that has been shaped and molded by similar doubt-distorting interests.
